Note to the Archaeologist:


You are about to embark on a historic adventure as you travel back in time to learn about the people of the past.

JOTHAM BIXBY: 1831 - 1916


Jotham Bixby was born in Maine. He came to
California during the Gold Rush. He started out as a
gold miner, but soon moved to Rancho Los
Cerritos to manage his family's sheep ranch.
Eventually, he sold some of his land to start the City
of Long Beach, so people call him the "Father of
Long Beach."




Mission San Gabriel (1771)

William M. Godfrey: 1825 - 1900



William Godfrey came to California during the Gold Rush. He didn't pan for gold, but he did travel all around the state. He was a photographer as well as a dentist, so he split his time between taking pictures and pulling teeth! He owned a photography studio in Los Angeles for a time, and he was the first person to photograph Rancho Los Cerritos in 1872.




Rancho Los Cerritos (2017)



Ah Ying was born in China. It is not known whether he came to California for the Gold Rush or later, but by 1870 he lived and worked at Rancho Los Cerritos. When the Bixbys owned the Rancho, Ying cooked breakfast, dinner, and supper for about 30 people every day. He also did all the laundry, a task that took two days each week! Ah Ying was a very important worker at the Rancho.

HARRY BIXBY: 1870 - 1902



Jotham Bixby's son, Harry, was born at Rancho Los
Cerritos. He loved to fish in the river, collect stamps, and
play marbles. He did not go to school when he was
young because there were no school houses
in the area. Fortunately, his mother and aunts could
teach him how to read, write, and do arithmetic. He was
also expected to do chores, like cleaning the rugs and
collecting eggs.

Sarah also enjoyed going to the beach and swimming in the river. She especially loved visiting her cousin at Christmas, Fourth of July, and sheep shearing time.
